SHOW RULES

- Please refer to the *VRGC Guide for Entrants to the Mini Show, 2016* for tips on how best to exhibit your flowers, fruits & vegetables.
- All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the show and three months prior for potted plants. Flowers in decorative division must be from the exhibitor's or a friend's garden (**NOT PURCHASED**).
- Exhibits are to be of 1 stem unless stated otherwise.
- Exhibitors may show more than one entry in a class provided they are different cultivars or species (see Definitions).
- Exhibitors are encouraged to use Club containers except in the Decorative and Potted Plant Division or if no suitable Club container is available. See *VRGC Guide*.
- The tabling of diseased/pest infested plant material is not permitted and such plant material will be removed.
- Unless otherwise specified, companion planting, specifically the growing of 2 or more plants of different cultivars, species or genera in one container is not permitted.
- Fruit and vegetable exhibits should contain the number of items specified in the *VRGC Guide*.
- The judges or the Show committee may subdivide classes in which there are large numbers of entries.

DECORATIVE DIVISION:

Exhibit: Plant material with or without accessories. Bases, backgrounds and title cards may be included. Plant material must predominate over all other components of the exhibit. Fresh plant material must be in water or in water-retaining material.

No artificial plant material. Painted and/or artificially coloured plant material will be accepted in Decorative Division only.

DEFINITIONS

(Additional Definitions in *VRGC Guide for Entrants to the Mini Show*)

Bloom: Individual flower, solitary flower or composite head. No buds.

Bowl: A container with the inside mouth wider than the container height as measured from the table surface to the containers highest point.

Always check maximum bowl size to avoid NAS disqualification.

Bulb: Includes corms, tubers and rhizomes.

Cultivar: Variety, as “Peace”, a rose cultivar or “Blue Lake”, a bean cultivar. PLEASE NAME CULTIVARS IF KNOWN. See *Guide* p. 12.

Floating: actually supported by the water, not resting on the bottom of the bowl.

Judging: To be done by *B.C. Council of Gardens Judging Standards for Non Specialized Shows, 2017*, and by the *VRGC Guide*. A further exception is for Chrysanthemums and Dahlias, which are to be judged “for garden effect only” - not as strictly as with B.C. Council of Gardens Judging Standards.

Jug: A container with a pouring lip and handle.

N.A.S.: “Not according to schedule”. Please take note of any Judges comments made on entry slips.

Novice: A competitor who has entered horticultural shows for less than 3 years, or who has won less than 3 first prize ribbons in that period.

Specimen: An individual item according to the classification: 1 plant, 1 bloom, 1 fruit, etc.

Display Only items may be in own containers and will not be judged.

Spike: A single upright stem bearing several flowers attached directly or on extremely short stalks (e.g. Gladiolus).

Spray: A multi-branched inflorescence, such as in Phlox, Spray Chrysanthemums, etc.

Stem: One spike, or one spray on its stalk, or a single blossom on its long stalk or pedicel. May include buds.

Vase: A container with the inside mouth width less than the height of the container.

(A) ROSE DIVISION - Unless otherwise stated, roses are to be displayed with a minimum of 1 set of attached composite leaves.

1. David Austin – any colour, no buds, 1/2 -3/4 open
2. Floribunda – any colour, no buds, 1/2-3/4 open
3. Grandiflora – any colour, no buds 1/2-3/4 open
4. Hybrid Tea – any colour, 1/2-3/4 open, no buds
5. Shrub roses – any colour, no buds, 1/2-3/4 open
6. Sprays – any cultivar, any colour, at least two blooms open
7. Miniature – 1 floating in stemmed glass with no foliage
8. Miniature – 1 growing in a suitable size pot
9. Miniature – 1 spray (at least two blooms open)
10. Miniature – 3 blooms in a club box with no foliage
11. Mini-flora or Patio Rose – 1 spray
12. Bowl of miniatures – minimum 9 blooms
13. Cycle of bloom (3 stems, 1 cultivar, own vase)
 - 1 Bud, coloured petals just beginning to unfurl, less than ¼ open
 - 1 Bloom, exhibition stage (1/2 - 3/4 open)
 - 1 Bloom, fully open (stamens may show)
14. Single bloom in a club frame with one or more of own leaflets. Entire entry must rest within frame
15. One floating rose – in own Brandy snifter (judged for fragrance)

NO foliage
16. Any type of bloom – 1 fully open with decorative stamens
17. Bud in own vase – 1/4 open with attached foliage
18. Bowl of roses – any type or types (other than minis) own foliage, at least 9 stems, own bowl
19. Display Only (not judged).

(B) DECORATIVE DIVISION - Designer's Choice.

20. Miniature exhibit not over 5 inches in dimension
21. Petite exhibit between 5 and 9 inches in dimension
22. "Anniversary Waltz"
23. Collection of perennials – 3 or more varieties, 1 or 2 cuts each, own foliage, balanced and pleasing to the eye.
24. Display Only (not judged).

(C) POTTED PLANT DIVISION - The tabling of diseased or pest infested plant material is not permitted and such plant material will be removed.

30. African violet
31. Orchid
32. Fern
33. Cacti
34. Container of Succulents – one variety
35. Container of Succulents – 2 or more varieties
36. Any other indoor plant – flowering, excluding those in 30 to 35
37. Any other indoor plant – foliage, excluding those in 30 to 35, (no buds or blossoms showing colour permitted).
38. Decorative outdoor plant/s in a container
39. Display Only (not judged)

(D) PERENNIAL DIVISION

40. Pansy, 3 stems, 1 variety less than 1.5" in a club container
41. Pansy, 3 stems, 1 variety more than 1.5" in a club container
42. Iris
43. Rock plant – 3 cut stems
44. Rock plant/s grown in a container
45. Peony – single, any colour
46. Peony – double, any colour
47. Poppy
48. Grasses, 3 cut stems
49. Decorative Foliage, non-woody plant, 1 to 5 cuts
50. Any other perennial
51. Display Only (not judged).

(E) ANNUALS

60. Sweet Peas – 6 stems, any colour
61. Any other annual - 3 stems
62. Display Only (not judged).

(F) FLOWERING SHRUB AND TREE DIVISION

70. Rhododendron – 1 truss
71. Clematis – less than 3" in diameter, any colour
72. Clematis – more than 3" in diameter, any colour
73. Any other flowering shrub
74. Any other flowering tree
75. Any other flowering vine
76. Decorative foliage of woody plant(s), 1 – 3 cuts
77. Display Only (not judged).

(G) VEGETABLE AND FRUIT DIVISION - Please refer to VRGC Guide for Entrants to the Mini Show, 2019 for tips on how best to exhibit your fruits and vegetables.

80. Peas – 5 pods
81. Asparagus – 3 stalks
82. Rhubarb – 3 stalks
83. Lettuce plant in water in own transparent container
84. Kale – 1 leaf in water
85. Swiss Chard – 1 leaf in water
86. Radish – 3 roots, turnip-rooted
87. Radish - 3 roots, long
88. Any fruit (see VRGC Guide for # of items)
89. Any other vegetable (see VRGC Guide for # of items)
90. Display Only (not judged).

(H) HERB DIVISION - Herbs should have no flowers and be named.

100. One herb growing in a pot
101. Pot of mixed herbs - minimum of four
102. Mixed herbs in water - minimum of four, own container
103. Display Only (not judged).

(I) JUNIOR DIVISION

- J-1 One small tray or container of labelled, growing seedlings
- J-2 Exhibit of flowers and foliage
- J-3 Miniature garden on a pie plate
- J-4 One clear container which shows the sprouting of one or more seeds, same variety, labelled.
